Lenten Meditations

VIA DOLOROSA

In Jerusalem, the path that Jesus is said to have followed on the way to being crucified is called the *Via Dolorosa* (Latin for the way of sorrow). The route has changed a bit over the years, and was not officially called *Via Dolorosa* before the 16th century. It begins at the Arch of Ecce Homo, where Pilate is said to have proclaimed: "Behold the Man" and ends at the site of Jesus' burial.

It is a winding, crowded path, where the faithful who are praying the Stations of the Cross have to dodge shopkeepers, tourists, and folks who are on their way to shop at the many shops that line the streets of the Old City of Jerusalem.

In the traditional form of the devotional prayer of the Stations of the Cross, there are 14 "stations." Each station represents a stopping place or significant moment of the passion of Christ after he was condemned by Pilate. Of the 14 stations, nine are described in the Gospels, while five are part of Church tradition. In 1991, Pope John Paul II celebrated a revised form of the Stations of the Cross in which all 14 stations are taken from the text of the Gospels.
