The Catholic Answer Book by Fr. Peter Stravinskis

Q. So often your magazine mentions the Magisterium. What is it? Is it the final authority in the Church?

***Very simply put, the Magisterium is made up of the Pope and the bishops teaching in union with him. Catholic doctrine is taught by them, individually or collectively, in an ordinary fashion or in a solemn manner (e.g., ecumenical council or a papal *ex-cathedra* statement) and is binding upon the faithful when they teach what the Church has always taught and believed. The teaching authority of the Church can never propose new doctrines for acceptance, as Congress might legislate or the Supreme Court might adjudicate brand new positions; rather, the function of the Magisterium is to safeguard the Deposit of Faith and to present it anew to each succeeding generation. ** At times, the official teachers in the Church will "define" dogma at a given point in history (e.g., Vatican I on the infallibility of the Church or Pope Pius XII on Mary's Assumption). But that does not mean a new teaching is being invented; rather, what has always been believed is being proposed for belief in a formal manner. ** More generally, however, there will be no extraordinary exercise of the Church's teaching authority; the teachers will simply teach through addresses, documents, and the like, all of which reinforce the ongoing Tradition. Therefore, one can readily see the Magisterium is indeed the final arbiter of Catholic doctrine for the whole Church.
