Assessment of SPP School's Catholic Identity

This school is Catholic, approved by the Local Ordinary (Canon 803), provides authentic Catholic teaching, opportunities for community worship and participation in the sacraments, and promotes evangelization and service to the community.

Continued from last week's bulletin:

Other opportunities for community worship include Eucharistic Adoration every First Friday, Reconciliation during Advent and Lent for students third through eighth grades, Stations of the Cross each Friday during Lent, First Communion celebration, Advent Prayer Services, Living Rosaries, and a Veteran's Day Prayer Service.

Throughout the year we enjoy various traditions which help us celebrate the deep richness of our faith. We have an all school Saint Nicholas celebration complete with St. Nick leaving "goodies" in our shoes. We prepare and attend a special Mass on the Feast Day of Our Lady of Guadalupe, and take part in cultural traditions of some of our school families. During Lent, we host a Hunger Banquet, allowing students and staff a unique perspective of how blessed we are here in the United States of America. We also fully embrace our Catholic identity during our week long celebration of Catholic School's Week.

Students are expected to appreciate, respect and have compassion for others. We provide opportunities for students to serve in school-wide, classroom, and individual service work. In our school "communities" we make cards for parish members to thank them for their support and to offer our encouragement through difficult times. Individual classes initiate various service projects. Some examples are visiting members in the retirement center baking cookies for the ladies craft bazaar, and holding food drives, and hosting a special dinner with proceeds going to help those affected by the disaster in Haiti. We also encourage service to others through our "Virtue of the Month" program. Students striving to exemplify each month's virtue are rewarded and acknowledged for their efforts. Our expectations for Catholic faith formation are outlined in the "Curriculum Guidelines for Catholic School Religious Education Programs," published by the Diocese of Boise. Our teachers are familiar with their grade level objectives and ensure that those expectations are met in their classrooms. Working to understand our Catholic identity is an ongoing process for staff and students.

Catholicism Answer Book

Q: Who has the final word: the Bible or the Church?

A: Martin Luther began the Protestant Reformation (sixteenth century AD) with the concept of *sola scriptura* (scripture alone) as the final authority in doctrinal matters. The council of Trent convened that same century and solemnly defined that the church, or more precisely, the teaching authority (Magisterium) of the Catholic Church had the ultimate and last word—not because it is superior to the Bible, but because the whole of divine revelation, from Sacred Scripture (Bible) to Sacred Tradition, was entrusted to the Church for protection and for proper interpretation.

Nowhere in the Bible does Jesus say to *read*, but He does often command that we listen. The written word did not come immediately, but the spoken and unwritten word did follow after Jesus performed His many miracles. Matthew 16:18-19 is the famous passage where Jesus says to Simon, “And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my *church*, and the powers of death shall not prevail against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven.” The Greek word *ekklesia* is translated as “church.” The passage makes it clear that the church is built by Christ, it is His Church, and it has the power to bind and to “loose” in heaven and on earth. How can the Word of God go against the will of God? If it is Jesus who built the Church and He gave it full authority to teach in His name, then there is no competition between the Bible and the Church any more than there can be opposition between Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition.
