Catholic Customs & Traditions ~ Scapular

The tradition of wearing the scapular began with St. Peter Damian's (d. 1072) promotion of Mary's role in helping the souls in purgatory. The scapular is usually two pieces of cloth, each about four square inches, joined by cord or ribbon and worn across the shoulders under one's clothing. It was originally an ordinary part of a monk's habit, much like a scarf or shawl. In its miniaturized form, it became symbolic of a cross or yoke. The Carmelite scapular is the most common. There is a legend that Mary appeared to St. Simon Stock in 1251 and showed him the brown scapular. The apparition promised that whoever wore it until death would be preserved from hell, and on the first Saturday after death would be taken by Mary from purgatory into heaven. The church has always been careful to point out that no religious article is miraculous in itself and that salvation always depends upon the life and faith of the wearer. Dozens of feast days and several holy days on the church's calendar pay honor to Mary's uniqueness as a person and her relationship to her son, Jesus Christ, and to members of the church. Two of these, the feasts of the Assumption (August 15) and the Immaculate Conception (December 8) are holy days in the United States.
